



### **Comfort Quilts**


I was very pleased to deliver a comfort quilt to Corlis Berchiolly on 12/21/20 in memory of her mother, who passed away in November.

The guidelines to receive a comfort quilt is as follows: personal health issues (cancer, transplant, major surgery), death of immediate family (parent, spouse, child and life-threatening situations (accident with injuries). A member may receive only one comfort quilt from the guild, even if they have different issues as stated above. 
Someone brought up Quilts of Valor and wanted to know if there are any groups active currently that you know about. Please give Bonnie/Silvia a call if you have any information.


