



I am a lifetime Rockfordian. I joined the Sinnissippi Quilters Guild about 2003. Although I had sewn since I was a teenager, I had never gotten into quilting. Being accustomed to garment sewing with a 5/8" seam, I truly thought that it was a **huge mistake** to use just 1/4". I have learned to trust the narrow seam and have never had something 'open up'.

I have learned SO MUCH through the guild monthly speakers and from the members who share so willingly of their experience and knowledge. Through the years my family members have received probably all of the quilts and wall hangings that they need/want. So I now create items for others and have enjoyed donating quilts for the children who enter the Rockford Foster Care Program and others. This is something that many of the SQG members have participated in and donated for. In fact over 80 quilts have been given to program so far this year. The children receive a quilt upon entering the program and are able to take the quilt with them when they are placed in a Foster Home; it is THEIRS to keep.

Another volunteer project was at the Rockford Rescue Mission. Jane Erickson and I would go to the mission each week and work with the women in the program to sew and create a quilt - many times they were sewing on a machine for the first time. This volunteer effort has been closed now especially since the onset of COVID.

It has been my pleasure to serve on the SQG board during the years. One of the greatest events for me has been the annual retreats at Lake Geneva! To be able to sew on any and all projects that YOU want to do. There are informal teaching moments, a book discussion on Saturday night, and gift drawings throughout the weekend. Join us if you can!! (Also the Center's food is outstanding.)

A huge thank-you to the current board who have served us during this most unusual COVID time!!

#### **ROBERTA SUESS**

I have been part of the guild for about 4 years. I love to sew - it is calming for me. I am married to Jeff and we have a blended family of 3 children (of the 2 legged type), and 4 grandchildren.

### **Sherry De Buhr**

Hello, I my name is Sherry De Buhr, and I am currently helping on Special Projects II. I go to the evening guilt meetings and was the evening Hospitality person (with a lot of help from Pam Surmo, Deanne Sparto & Roberta Suess, when Covid hit.

I have been sewing since before 1968, I remember my mother signing me up at Ken-Rock (at that time located on Bildahal St., I believe). Do you remember the Earthquake that hit Rockford in Nov of 68? After doing a little research I fought out that my Pfaff machines were owned by "Husquarna Viking" so I guess I had stayed in the family.


# **COMFORT QUILTS**






