


Emails from the guild are now being sent from a guild email address instead of my personal email: sqi2101@gmail.com.

We meet the third Friday of the month at Sunshine Quilts in Belvidere. Drop by whenever you would like.


COMFORT QUILTS

The purpose of a comfort quilt is to show the care and concern of our fellow quilting sisters going through a traumatic time in their life. The guidelines to receive a comfort quilt is as follows: personal health issues (cancer, transplant, major surgery), death of immediate family (parent, spouse, child) and life threatening situations (accident with injuries). A member may receive only one comfort quilt from the guild, even if they have different issues as stated above.

The designated "Sunshine" person in the guild is responsible for spreading sunshine and encouragement to those in the guild who need it. She will send get well, sympathy or other appropriate cards when notified. To be notified, someone in the guild calls/texts her with information about a person in need. This could be someone who has had surgery, or a hospital stay or a serious illness. She then sends her an appropriate card for the situation from the guild. There is a book she can log in the information to keep track of cards sent. She is responsible for purchasing cards/ stamps and turning in her expenses as needed. 

DONATIONS TO THE GUILD

During the year, Sinnissippi Quilters periodically receives donations of both money and quilting-related goods. I am the person who has volunteered to compose the official letters that the givers receive acknowledging their donations.

I need your help because the Internal Revenue Service has some specific requirements and guidelines that charities such as ours need to follow.

If you are the person who receives a donation to the guild, the following is information that we need:

Donor's name

Donor's mailing address

Donor's contact information (either phone or email)

What exactly they gave (description of goods and quantities where possible)

The date of the donation

As an example of a description of goods, you might say "12 yards quilting fabric". No need to be more specific than that. Estimate quantities where feasible.

Some people may indicate that they do not need a donation letter. That's OK – we then don't have to send one. For anyone to include the donation on their income taxes, they need to have that letter from us. With the exception of gifts of money, the responsibility for valuing their donation rests with the giver not the guild.

If anyone has questions about this, please contact me directly and I'll be happy to help. Thanks.


