


# **COMFORT QUILTS**

The purpose of a comfort quilt is to show the care and concern of our fellow quilting sisters going through a traumatic time in their life. The guidelines to receive a comfort quilt is as follows: personal health issues (cancer, transplant, major surgery), death of immediate family (parent, spouse, child) and life threatening situations (accident with injuries). A member may receive only one comfort quilt from the guild, even if they have different issues as stated above.

The designated "Sunshine" person in the guild is responsible for spreading sunshine and encouragement to those in the guild who need it. She will send get well, sympathy or other appropriate cards when notified. To be notified, someone in the guild calls/texts her with information about a person in need. This could be someone who has had surgery, or a hospital stay or a serious illness. She then sends her an appropriate card for the situation from the guild. There is a book she can log in the information to keep track of cards sent. She is responsible for purchasing cards/ stamps and turning in her expenses as needed. #### **Banner Challenge Announced**

Our next quilt show will be held in May 2024 and will include another banner challenge. We will be doing a temperature quilt for the month of your birthday. Karen Grover is overseeing this project and her birthday is in February, so she will record the high and low temperatures for each day of February, refer to the color chart, design a 3" finished block to represent this information, and create an approx. 6" x 54" banner. The last rectangle of the banner will be a 3"x6" rectangle showing the month and year. There may be some blank squares and you can put them anywhere and do anything with them, but you need to fill in all 16 rows of 2 blocks each. When we hang all of these in a row, we should get a spectacular look at next year's weather. Just a note that we should all use the colors as shown, however, they can be any type of fabric: i.e., prints, batiks, reproduction, solids. The colors shown are from a Kona Cotton chart and those are Kona's fabric name if you get stuck.

Karen will be available to answer any questions. Her email and phone number are in the directory. She suggests you wait until the month or two prior to your birthday month to gather the instructions. They will be available either from her at the meetings or on our website. We hope you enjoy this adventure into something that is very popular right now. Ideas for how to set up your blocks can be found on Pinterest or by searching for 'temperature quilts' on your main page. Have fun and we look forward to seeing them at show and tell as they get finished. For those of you who are forgetful, there will be a reminder as your birthday month gets closer.


