There were 0 pillowcases on hand; 28 received; 10 to UW delivered; 18 on hand.

There were 3 fidget quilts on hand; 8 received; 8 to UW delivered; 3 on hand.

Placemats made and delivered 198 to Lifescape.

Rock House Kids pillowcases – 200. Since more were received than Rock House needed, 35 will go to Carpenter's Place and the remainder will go to UW pediatrics.
